Home Modification Information and Specialized Services.

Making a home accessible isn't necessarily a catastrophic event. Sometimes a claim simply requires a [transitional modification](#) that is not permanent. You can count on Accessibility Design to meet your needs.

Minnesota is unique. Minnesota Statute 176.137 has a specific [benefit](#) to be used toward modification of the injured workers existing home to accommodate their needs secondary to the work related injury, or in certain cases in which this is not feasible, toward the purchase of the alternate dwelling.

To be awarded the benefit, Minnesota has set forth specific requirements and procedures that must be followed.
